

Coyotes and Your Dog

When walking your dog, be alert and remember that small dogs are prey to coyotes.

Coyotes can easily scale a 6-foot wall so never leave small dogs (or cats) outside.

If your dog needs to go outside at night, you should go with him as coyotes have been known to wait for dogs when they venture out to relieve themselves during the night.

Coyotes will eat dog feces so be sure to keep your yard picked up and remove other coyote attractants; such as fallen fruit, unsecured garbage, and pet food.

Never feed or attempt to tame coyotes.

Did you know...

DOG LICENSE REQUIRED



Los Alamitos Municipal Code § 6.08.010 requires all dogs over the age of 4 months be licensed. Dog licensing laws actually came about for public

safety reasons, primarily to make sure dogs are up to date on rabies vaccinations. It can also be their ticket home. Dog licenses for the City of Los Alamitos can be obtained by contacting our animal control service provider:

CLEANING UP AFTER YOUR DOG

Dog owners are responsible for picking up after their dogs.



LAMC §6.16.200

LEASH REQUIRED

Los Alamitos Municipal Code § 6.16.100 requires that you keep your dog on a leash when on any public street, park, or other public place. The

leash cannot be more than eight-feet long and must be held continuously in the hands of a person capable of controlling the dog.



Dogs must be kept on leash when in City Parks.

To enjoy your pet off-leash, go to a dog park or other area which has been designated for that purpose. Arbor Dog Park is located off Lampson Avenue between Los Alamitos Boulevard and Valley View Street.

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE

Dog owners are legally responsible for any injury caused by their aggressive dog.



DO NOT LEAVE YOUR PET IN CAR

The Police Department receives many calls about dogs locked in vehicles. Do not leave your dog alone in the car. The inside of your car will quickly heat up, leading to heat stroke, even when it might not seem that hot outside.
